
Thank you to Nigel Clayton for erecting and lighting our fantastic Christmas Tree.

Crime prevention scheme extended to Kellington



The North Yorkshire Police and Crime Commissioner accessed a Home Office grant to be spent on providing free home security checks, and free security upgrades to vulnerable doors and windows, detached garages and sheds for homes and farms in the South of the Selby District. The scheme has now been extended to Kellington and Eggborough.

Every household in Kellington will be receiving a letter about the scheme in the new year telling you how to apply for the free security check. During that check they will identify locks etc that need an upgrade, and that will be done for FREE

PLEASE NOTE No-one is going to cold call you about this scheme. All visits will be pre-booked. If anyone rings you or knocks on your door claiming to be part of this scheme – THEY ARE NOT!
