

## Kellington Parish Council Chair Annual Report

The HMS Kellington lifebelt found a home, it is now on display in Kellington Manor.

The Community Infrastructure Levy(CIL) monies, the Parish Council received from Selby District Council in 2021/22 were £3,396.25.

The Parish Council is aware that the Village Hall lease with the Diocese of Leeds does not have long to run. In conjunction with the Village Hall Committee we want to see the heating at the hall upgraded. To do that will require grant funding and grant funders will only fund sustainable projects. So the Parish Council is, working with the Village Hall Committee to get an extension to the lease.

The Vehicle Activated Sign was erected on Eastfield Lane.

The grass cutting was put out to tender and “Adams” who have provided a consistently excellent service, were successful.

Councillor Mary McCartney facilitated a grant to provide a pedestrian access for the Lunn Lane, Church Lane junction.

The play park saw repairs and upgrades of equipment. The PC want to see better disabled access and are looking for grant funding to get that done.

The Parish Councillors work with the Village Hall committee and residents to hold regular coffee mornings including events on behalf of Macmillan and the British Legion.

The Parish Council put up the British Legion poppies on streetlights and in the notice board and this year purchased a “Tommy” which was displayed on Eastfield Lane. The Remembrance Sunday Service was well attended.

Our village remains clean (many thanks to all the litter pickers and to all those who use the litter bins) and tidy. The Planters looked good (again, thanks to the residents who maintain them) and the daffodil display was delightful. The PC continue to cut the grass at St Edmunds Church Yard.
